Materials

- Wreath Form
- Yarn
- Laser Cut Wood Flowers
- Laser Cut Wood Hello Text
- Paint
- Paintbrush
- White Glue

Yarn Wreath

Notes

Supplies and colors may vary from pictures.

This project is simple but very time consuming. Fortunately, you can work on it whenever you have free time.

Instructions

1. Before starting, we need to make a yarn ball out of the yarn you received.
 - a. To do this you will find the end of the yarn that is buried in the center.
 - b. Then, hold the yarn between your thumb and forefinger.



- c. Wrap the yarn around your fingers as many times as you wish.



- d. Take it off your hand and hold the yarn horizontally.

- e. Wrap the yarn around the middle.



f. Fold in the edges and wrap yarn around them to secure them.



g. Wrap and rotate the ball until there are no more pieces sticking out.



h. Continue wrapping and rotating until all the yarn is wrapped in a ball.

2. Next, paint the flowers and “Hello” text. Let dry completely.

3. Clean your paint brush with water. Squeeze dry with a paper towel, tissue, or napkin.

4. Now, tie the loose end of the yarn to the wreath form. Make sure the knot is secure, so it doesn't come undone as you are working.

5. Now, wrap the yarn ball around the wreath form (about 12 times), then smush them down to the knot.



6. Continue wrapping and smushing until the whole form is wrapped in yarn.

7. Tie the end just like you tied at the beginning. Then, tuck it inside the form so you don't see the knot.

8. Plan where you want the flowers and “Hello” text to go.

9. Use the brush to apply the white glue to the back of the flowers and “Hello” text. Then, attach to the yarn wrapped wreath.

10. Hang your completed wreath and enjoy!

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
